70 years = 613,620 hours = 42,953,400 heart beats @ 70 beats/minute


80 years = 701,280 hours = 49,089,600 heart beats @ 70 beats/minute






Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."

¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day.


